ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT

The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

Every Friday, for one hour following the 8:00am Mass in the Chapel of the Women Doctors of the Church, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Please plan on coming to pray. Be sure to pray for Peace in the Holy Land with the Peace Dove that is lit on the side altar. Prayer cards with the history of the origins of the Dove and suggested prayers are in the basket by the Dove.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

I have been reading and absorbing different ways that pastors have approached their parishes in the wake of these dreadful times as we face, once again, the horror of multi-faceted abuse in the church by her priests and bishops. Some write with anger, some with sadness. Many try to find the balance between spiritual and legal steps forward. My own experience in the parish this past week would mirror the importance of all these approaches. Understandably, some parishioners vented their anger at us priests; others offered prayers for purification and courage. All responses are expected and must be revered.

In the midst of all the news and commentary, it is critical that we realize that what we are witnessing is spiritual warfare. The evil one (or Satan or the devil) hates the church and uses the horrible sins and crimes of priests and bishops as a way to destroy her. Yes, there is need for the strictest adherence to canon and civil law; yes, Cardinal Seán's call for a broader and more sustained role for the laity in the life of the church must be heeded and acted on; yes, outreach and care for those who have been harmed must continue to be offered. But what is most important is to fight evil with the spiritual treasures of the church. All Catholics have to increase, not walk away from, the richness of Christ through participation at Mass. All Catholics should reach out in charity to the homeless, to the sick, to survivors of any kind of abuse, to pro life ministries, and in support our Food Pantry and St. Vincent de Paul Society. All Catholics ought to pray the rosary regularly, and read and emulate the lives of the saints. All Catholics must return to the regular use of the Sacrament of Confession and turn away from any activities that are not of God as revealed to us in the Commandments. And we all have to fast and do penance. This would only be the beginning, but an important one, and in committing ourselves more intentionally to these works, then, from them, will flow the best and truest wisdom for the ways forward.

Fr. George, Fr. Patrick and I are considering next steps, and we will continue these conversations with the Parish Council in early September. I am always grateful for your insights and input at any time.

We offer a dignified way for people to stay afloat so they don't become the poorest of the poor.
