**ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT**

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

**ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT**

**Every Friday, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses).**

Please plan on coming to pray. Be sure to pray for Peace in the Holy Land with the Peace Dove that is lit on the side altar. Prayer cards with the history of the origins of the Dove and suggested prayers are in the basket by the Dove. Also, if you could sign up for an hour a week, or once a month, that would be great. Please contact the main office or see the sign up sheet at the Church entrance. We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

## TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

The swirling of events in the church these days is overwhelming and our present culture's penchant for non-stop news feed, though sometimes useful, tends to elevate the complexity and lack of focus. So let's remember to pray for and support all victims and survivors of abuse of any kind that has happened at the hands of priests, bishops, or others in the church. Let's pray for a purification of all members of the Church, and especially, in these days, those called to the responsibility of servant leadership. And let us find and call for the right actions that will lead us forward. Christ, the Head of the Body, the Church, is the Way, the Truth and the Life; with commitment to that central relationship, the gates of hell will not prevail against us.

**I was invited** last week to speak to the "Graduate Student and Young Professionals Verbum Dei Weekly Bible Study Group" (how's that for a mouth-full!) about these difficult issues. About fifty attended. The dialogue was sober, heart-felt, and I hope, constructive. I made some observations and clarifications about things and some good ideas for future action were offered by those who attended. **I have also met with a number of parishioners who have asked to see me, as have Fr. Patrick and Fr. George.** At this writing, I am about to head off for a gathering of priests of Boston with Cardinal Seán. I am meeting with our own Parish Council on September 10.

**I very much want to have a Town Meeting for the Parish,** the kind that I have been holding since my arrival here. The difficulty has been finding a place in the schedule. We normally hold these Town Meetings on Sunday afternoons. However, there are none available throughout all of September, nor other weekend times, given parish activities and some long standing commitments for me. So, though it is not ideal, as a start, we will have an open Town Meeting on **Monday, September 17 at 7:00pm-8:30pm in DiGiovanni Hall.**

**We are excited to welcome all students to and back to St. Paul's.** The University and Harvard Catholic Center are already buzzing! At the Choir School, our new Head of School, and new and returning teachers and staff have been readying themselves for this week's start. If you know anyone who even at this late date might be interested in our school, please send him our way!

On Saturday, September 22, we will have a **training session for anyone interested in becoming a Eucharistic Minister or a lector.** We will begin after the 9:00am Mass and meet in the church. More details to follow.

As to plaster and other work in the church, more bad news has emerged. We have discovered that a large support beam, above the traditional confessional, has rotted through. Engineers will be in to assess the damage and the way forward. No dull moments.
