**ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT**

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

**ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT**

**Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses).** Please plan on coming to pray. Also, If you could sign up for an hour a week, or once a month, that would be great. Please contact the main office or see the sign up sheet at the Church entrance. We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

## TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parishioners,

While Fr. Kelly is finishing up his annual retreat this weekend, I thought I would take this opportunity to give you a little update as to what I've been up to the past two months with our undergraduate chaplaincy.

Last weekend we sponsored a 3-day retreat in southern Massachusetts led by a Dominican priest, Fr. James Brent. The retreat was entitled "Father's House," with the theme being the story of the Prodigal Son from the Gospel. Fr. James gave three inspiring talks on the love of our Heavenly Father and our identity as his beloved sons and daughters. With plenty of time for silent meditation, adoration, confession, and healing prayer, there were many powerful moments of grace. I think that all 27 students from the Harvard Catholic Center (as well as the 25 students from other colleges) came away with transformed hearts and a renewed vigor to their faith. All of them are already looking forward to our spring retreat, which I begin planning now!

We also have a great series of speakers for this semester called "Theology by the Slice" and co-sponsored by the Thomistic Institute. We started off the year with Professor Zena Hitz speaking on the value of leisure, this coming week we have Fr. John Baptist Ku O.P. speaking on why we call God "Father," and then in November we'll welcome the nationally-renowned moral theologian, Dr. Janet Smith, to give one of her famous talks, "Why is sex complicated?" These talks are all given in lecture halls on campus with the hope of attracting as many non-Catholics as possible.

Finally, over the course of the next couple of months I'll be welcoming several local religious sisters to offer the meditation for our weekly "Totus Tuesday" Holy Hour on Tuesday evenings and spend some time with the students afterward. (Of course, everyone is invited to the Holy Hour!) I like having guests lead the Holy Hour so that it's not always me giving the meditation! It's also a great opportunity for promoting religious life and raising awareness that there are many wonderful religious sisters and communities right here in Boston.
