**ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT**

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

**Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses).** Please plan on coming to pray. We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

## THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

It was at an Adams House reception in Aphthorp House that an undergrad asked me: "Can Catholics believe in evolution?" It turned out that she herself was a Catholic so I reminded her that it was taught in Dominican, Jesuit and Augustinian colleges. When that "proof" didn't work, I asked her a question.

That summer on the way to Chartwell, I had stopped at Down House where Darwin had lived after the voyage of the HMS Beagle. All the downstairs was as he had left it, but exhibits upstairs told of the discovery of natural selection, its progress and acceptance. Why, I asked her, was there a one by two foot photo of Pope John Paul II on the wall in the last room? "I have no idea," she said, as would have I, except that I'd already seen the Pope's quote next to it: "Evolution has been proven." Even with that, there's much to puzzle us while sorting out the roles of science and religion, so that it was a delight to have Prof. Ken Miller, biologist at Brown University, speak to a packed DiGiovanni Hall on "Evolution in Light of the Compatibility of Faith and Reason."

Our grad students and young professionals join regularly in Lumen Veritatis, a theology seminar, which has been aptly reading St. John Paul II's "Fides et Ratio," outlining the very same concerns, respecting the rights of faith and of religion.

Our medical students are generously invited every year to Mass and dinner by the St. Luke's Guild of Catholic Physicians. The former dean of Boston College Law School, Dr. John Garvey, whom I used to have speak to our law students addressed our medical students this year, sharing the concerns and discernment he worked through now as president of the Catholic University of America, regarding the stem cell research going on there.

If you want to send a message, they say, send it in a person. Aware how true that is, we meet each month to try to hear from people about their lives and work and faith. These grad student meetings are entitled "Cor ad Cor Loquitur," after the motto of the famous convert, John Henry Cardinal Newman, but the line is actually taken from St. Francis de Sales: "Lips merely speak to the ears. Heart speaks directly to heart!"

This month in Cor ad Cor, we heard Jana Kiely tell us the gripping story of her life of faith. Born in Prague and facing in turn the Nazis and Communists, she moved during her years at the Sorbonne in Paris from the nominal Catholicism, not uncommon in the Czech lands, through a heartfelt conversion to Our Lord, to a life of service to all of us. With her husband Bob Kiely she was Faculty-Dean of Adams House twenty-six years and also Director of Religious Education here at St. Paul's. This week as we go to press, we look forward to a Faculty Fireside Chat with Prof. Luis Giron-Negron, as you have no doubt seen from our posters.

Thank you for all you do to welcome and support our graduate students, post-docs and young professionals here.
