ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses). Please plan on coming to pray. Also, If you could sign up for an hour a week, or once a month, that would be great. Please contact the main office or see the sign up sheet at the Church entrance. We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

Last weekend was jam packed but very exciting and encouraging. We had the Art Fair, a lecture, a concert, baptisms, a wedding, RCIA, Confirmation classes, Faith Formation for the children, Oktoberfest, Communion brought to those who are homebound, confessions, and seven Masses! Thanks to all who help to make these important parts of parish life possible.

I would ask you to mark your calendars for an important **Prayer Service this Friday, October 12 from 7:30pm-9:00pm**. As many face the hurt, sadness and anger engendered by the abuse crisis in the church, we rightfully speak of changes in policy, structures, and other practical ways forward. As we have and should always remember, at the heart of these infidelities and crimes is sin and a lack of holiness. For that reason, along with many other parishes in the area, we will take time, as clergy and as a parish, to pray and ask God's grace for healing for victims and survivors, and purification, repentance and the renewal of the Church, that it might truly be a Light to all nations, as called for by Vatican II. After consultation with the Parish Liturgy Committee, the evening will include Eucharistic Adoration, readings from Sacred Scripture, music, and recitation of the Rosary, with special meditations written by Bishop Robert Barron for this moment in the Church. I hope you can join us for all or part of the evening. If you are not able, please take some time wherever you are to pray for those most in need of healing.

Many of you involved with the meetings we have so frequently at the Parish have no doubt spent time in the second floor "Multimedia Room." The name has always struck me as rather banal. After consultation with different folks, I've decided to re-name it the "**Bishop John P. Boles Conference Room**." Bishop Boles was pastor here from 1975 to 1992 and oversaw the construction of the present Parish Center/Choir School/Harvard Catholic Center/Rectory building at 29 Mount Auburn Street. We are happy to remember him in this way.

The repair work in our church building continues, as you can easily see. There are at least two projects at play. One is the on-going repair of much of the plaster in the church. The second, bigger concern/work will be the replacement of a rotted beam discovered during the plaster repair near the old confessional and St. Joseph Altar. We will have to remove part of the church roof, the source of the water damage, and bring a new steel beam in by crane. A larger section of the church interior ceiling will have to be removed as well. When the beam is in place, the ceiling will be repaired, and the section of roof replaced. Given all the work, we will move ahead with a painting project in the church that had originally been scheduled for 2020. All this, obviously, will require a Capital Campaign. I will provide a monetary goal as things get clearer. However, we are looking to make it payable over time through 2023, which is the 100th anniversary of the Church building. Improved lighting and a few other smaller projects will also be part of the plan. Not easy news, I know, but together, we will do what has to be done.

On a lighter note, we will have our annual **Blessing of the Animals on Saturday, October 6 in honor of St. Francis of Assisi**. It will take place at 9:30am and we will meet in the courtyard. Good weather is projected!!

Also, next week in Rome, the church celebrates the **canonization of Archbishop Oscar Romero and Pope Paul VI**, both prophets in our time. Pray for us! God bless, Fr. Kelly
