ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses).

Please plan on coming to pray. Also, If you could sign up for an hour a week, or once a month, that would be great. Please contact the main office or see the sign up sheet at the Church entrance. We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

I returned from a restful retreat time away and the next day attended the Choir School Halloween party. In the midst of Roman gladiators, magicians and multiple Spider Men, I also managed to get tricked into taking a high tower of whipped cream to the face from an innocent looking toy! I was happy, too, that the next day was the Feast of All Saints, when the boys had a formal luncheon and gave wonderful reports on their favorite saints and how they would try to emulate their example.

November is a month when we recall and pray for all our beloved dead and those who have no one to pray for them.

We were so blessed again this year to offer an All Souls Mass here in the parish on November 2, with our St. Paul's Choir of Boys and Men providing the glorious music from Faure's, *Requiem*. Just a reminder that we also have a Book of Remembrance available in the Marian Shrine by the St. Joseph Altar where you can inscribe the names of loved ones, along with envelopes in the vestibule of the church that you could fill out, providing the names of folks for whom we will offer Mass throughout the month. May they rest in peace.

We've also been fortunate to have had **several well received lectures** on topics ranging from Michelangelo's *Last Judgment* to explorations of the church's deeply human and majestic understanding of sexuality. Please continue to support these offerings.

An update on the present work in the church: plaster and ceiling repair will proceed to the side section by the murals of St. Patrick near the chancel organ and then continue back up the aisle on the Bow St. side. We are hoping this work will be completed by Christmas. The more invasive work on the other side of the church has begun in earnest. The roof tiles have been removed, revealing a severely compromised piece of real estate! A crane has been ordered which will lower a new steel beam through the roof, replacing the one that has rotted through. This, too, we hope will be finished by Christmas. In January, we will begin a painting project that will address the Stations of the Cross, the walls along the main part of the nave, the ceilings by the St. Joseph Altar and the chancel organ, and the capitals of the columns. I will announce soon a time when we will offer a brief tour of the proposed work.

This brings with it steps being explored for a Capital Campaign. Given the expenses incurred by these repairs and, with a more hopeful look to the 100th anniversary of the church in 2023 and the 150th anniversary of the parish in 2025, we are looking at the possibility of a major fundraising effort. We will have more information just before or after Christmas.

A final request: as the bishops of the United States gather for their annual meeting, please offer prayers and fasting for them. With their leadership challenged in many ways, compromised by a lack of truth, fidelity and courage, they need our prayers to be the shepherds they are ordained to be and that Jesus calls them to be. For our part, let us all be examples and models of holiness to all we meet.
