**ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT**

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

**ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT**

**Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses).** Please plan on coming to pray. Also, If you could sign up for an hour a week, or once a month, that would be great. Please contact the main office or see the sign up sheet at the Church entrance. We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)**

I hope that you all had a good Thanksgiving. Today, the **Feast of Christ the King**, is one of the most striking of the liturgical year. It not only reminds us of the Lord's sovereignty over all things, but it also caps the liturgical year with great majesty. **Next week, we begin the holy season of Advent. I am very grateful to our tremendous Parish Choir for leading us in Lessons and Carols on Sunday, December 2 at 3:00pm to help us begin the season so prayerfully.**

We're also blessed at St. Paul's to have a **series of concerts throughout December** to prepare us for the great celebration of Christmas. **The St. Paul's Choir of Boys and Men will offer their well loved concerts on two Sundays, December 9 and December 16 at 3:00pm.** Tickets (and CD's...both great gifts!) are available through the Choir School website, by phoning the school, and after some Masses. By the way, if you know a family or boy who might be interested in attending the Choir School, encourage them to come to one of the concerts. As an incentive, I will be happy to pick up the cost of their tickets.

**On Wednesday, November 28, we will have our first Advent Luncheon Community Meal** for the homeless of the area, and those happy to join in a common meal. See the bulletin for details, but volunteers and certain food items are always welcome.

**Sunday, December 2 will be a busy day here.** At **12:30pm**, Professor Chip Piatti and I will give a 15 minute explanation of the proposed painting of a number of elements in the church following all the repair work that has been undertaken. It will take place in the church. Then, Professor Piatti will offer the third in his lecture series at **1:00pm** in the Boles Conference room on the second floor of the Parish Center. This is followed by the previously mentioned Lessons and Carols at **3:00pm**.

As noted at Mass last week, **please remember that the weekend of December 8/9 is also Offertory Increase Commitment weekend.** There are pledge forms available in the church vestibule and more information in the bulletin and on the website.

The noticeable change in weather reminds us of the movement of time. Together, we can pause and reflect on all that God accomplishes through, with and in us as we trust in His love.
