ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses). Please plan on coming to pray. Also, If you could sign up for an hour a week, or once a month, that would be great. Please contact the main office or see the sign up sheet at the Church entrance. We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parishioners,

Once again, Lent is just around the corner! It is now prime time to be thinking about what you will do for Lent: how you might fast or give up something, what extra spiritual practices you might take on, and what extra works of Mercy you might do. In fact, this period of preparation is so important that up until recently in Church history, it was seen as a liturgical season unto itself. Traditionally, the 17 days leading up to Ash Wednesdays began with a week of Septuagesima, followed by Sexagesima, and finally with the half-week before Ash Wednesday called Quinquagesima. The basic point of this preparatory season is that Lent is such a special time in the liturgical year for growing closer to God that we need significant time to plan for it. While those titles were dropped from the liturgical calendar in 1969, we can still apply the spirituality. Next week we'll have for you a flyer with a schedule of all the Lenten activities taking place at St. Paul's.

Once again we invite you to Fr. Abishai Vase's Mass of Thanksgiving here at St. Paul's on Sunday, March 3, at 11:00am. This was originally scheduled for January, but was cancelled due to the blizzard. After being ordained at his home cathedral in Abu Dhabi on January 4, Fr. Vase has returned to Boston to complete one more semester of studies at St. John's Seminary before returning home permanently. As many of you remember him from his years as an undergraduate student at Harvard, it is an honor to have "one of our own" return to give thanks for the many graces received through St. Paul's and the Harvard Catholic Center. Congratulations, Fr. Vase!

Thank you to everyone who came out to my show a couple weeks ago in the lower church hall. We counted over 200 in attendance and it was a great opportunity for many of the different groups at St. Paul's to be together. We had a great time performing for you and hope to do it again in the future.

For the undergraduate community, the new semester is off to a great start with our newly-elected student leadership, aka the "SteerCom." I've started attending lunch once a week at Dunster House (one of the undergraduate communities) to give students a chance to see me outside of St. Paul's. We're in the midst of finalizing plans for our biggest event of the year: the Spring Retreat. We're hoping to bring 50 students by bus up to Kennebunkport, Maine for a 3-day retreat lead by Fr. Marvin Bearis, OFM Cap.
