**ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT**

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

**ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT**

**Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses).** Please plan on coming to pray.

Also, If you could sign up for an hour a week, or once a month, that would be great. Please contact the main office or see the sign up sheet at the Church entrance. We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)**

Remember that daily Mass, Friday Stations of the Cross and confession are great aids to our spiritual lives, as well as the acts of charity easily within our grasp.

**I would especially like to draw your attention to the Saturday, March 23 Lenten Hour of Prayer.** This will be an opportunity for members of all the St. Paul's community to come together in DiGiovanni Hall for simple prayer, reflection, and singing. **Gather at 10:30am for snacks with prayer from 11:00am-12:00pm.** All ages, all welcome.

**You can see that the plaster repairs and church painting project are moving forward,** each day bringing us closer to a Holy Week completion. We have begun more serious conversations about a Capital Campaign, and we will fill you in as the path forward becomes clearer.

**Finally, I hope that you have a good St. Patrick's Day.** As patron saint of our Archdiocese, and as a great intercessor well represented by the murals and statue at the right front transept of our church, it is good and just to celebrate his feast day!

**FOOD PANTRY**

Many food pantries send clients home with a bag of items that they can't or won't eat, some of which may even be donated to another food pantry. They may tell donors that they distribute X pounds of food to families in need, but they have not really accomplished their goal. In contrast, our model together with your generous response to our requests, allows us to provide items that people truly appreciate. **Some of the most needed items currently are coffee (including decaf, instant, and whole bean), cereal, and healthy snacks. We are often unable to meet the demand for nuts, trail mix, dried fruit, canned fruit, crackers, and granola bars.**
