ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses). Please plan on coming to pray.

Also, If you could sign up for an hour a week, or once a month, that would be great. Please contact the main office or see the sign up sheet at the Church entrance. We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

Dear Friends,

He is Risen! He is truly Risen!! There is no better way to wish you the blessings of a Happy Easter than to proclaim the message which is at its heart. I pray that this celebration and the truth of the Lord's love will inspire many wonderful gatherings for your families and friends. **We want to congratulate and welcome warmly all those who were fully received into the Roman Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil.** Your faith, presence and example are what help the Body of Christ to continue to flourish. And we are so grateful to the sponsors and the RCIA team for all their work.

We are especially happy that the repairs and renovations of the church are 98% complete for these Easter days (I'll let you find the two percent!) The magnificence of our treasured church building carries new vitality as the restored plaster and new colors help to highlight so much detail in the arches, the Stations of the Cross, the tableaux from the life of St. Paul on the left and right below the choir loft, the Marian Shrine, the murals, the tromp l'oeil above the chancel organ, the cleaned stained glass windows and the statues of the Sacred Heart, Isaiah, Saints Peter, Paul, Patrick and Joseph. Thanks to our staff, to the team from Graham Painters and Inspired Ornamentals, and to parishioners David Dankens and Chip Piatti for their time and professional acumen, without which we would never have been able to so successfully bring this project to completion.

I want to thank all those who helped to prepare for our Holy Week services: priests, deacons, servers, lectors, ushers, decorators, cleaners. I want to thank our Liturgy Committee, especially Judy Beatrice, and the Choir School Parents Guild. I want to thank the Harvard students who gave so much time and elbow grease to polishing and moving candles sticks, the crucifix, and liturgical furniture. And thanks to all our musicians in the Parish Choir and in the St. Paul's Choir of Boys and Men. Though we are sorry to see Director Mr. Robinson depart our shores for a new post in England, we are grateful to him for his nine years of service and for his tremendous work over these days.

On Tuesday, I will be joining the Choir School on a pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City, Mexico. Praying in this place has long been a dream of mine, and to do it with the Choir School is an added bonus. Please keep the boys (and chaperones!) in your prayers.

Remember that the entire week after Easter is to be celebrated as Easter day itself. After a long Lent of penances, make it a great and full week of praise and feasting.

Divine Mercy Sunday – April 28, 2019

On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. (Diary of St. Faustina, #699)

This day is truly an extraordinary opportunity! Jesus offers us the singular gift of a complete renewal of baptismal grace: a total cleansing of the soul of past sins and a renewal within us all the gifts and graces of the Holy Spirit. There is no other devotion in the Church with such a promise! In order to receive this grace, the basic requirements are thus:

1. Be in a state of grace (recent confession of all mortal sin)
2. Receive Holy Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday with complete trust in God's mercy
3. Venerate the Divine Mercy Image

In honor of this great feast, the **Chaplet of Divine Mercy** will be recited at **4:30pm** in the church, and **confession will be available 4:30pm - 6:00pm**, during the 5:00pm Mass. Jesus is waiting for you to receive abundantly from the torrents of His infinite mercy!
