ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses).

Please plan on coming to pray. Also, If you could sign up for an hour a week, or once a month, that would be great. Please contact the main office or see the sign up sheet at the Church entrance. We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear Friends,

The many blessings of Lent continue. Believe it or not, next week is Palm Sunday! A reminder that the 9:30 am Mass is moved to 9:00am for Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. Take advantage of these Lenten days to prepare for Holy Week with continued fasting, prayer, almsgiving, and the opportunity for confession (see the bulletin for more information).

We've been very happy to welcome Deacon Tim O'Donnell back to St. Paul's and are grateful for his diaconal ministry. I have asked Deacon Tim to take on an important role. He will serve as Director of Parish Ministries, a newly created post here at St. Paul's. In this capacity, Deacon Tim will be the primary liaison for me and the staff to the over twenty ministries that are active here in the parish. He will be able to respond to any questions or needs those groups might have, but more importantly, he will help to support them as they grow spiritually, in membership, and in their identity as parish agents of bringing the Gospel of Christ and the Church to our parishioners and beyond. In this capacity, he is also taking an important role in crafting into prose our Parish Pastoral Plan. The PPP will be the culminating phase of almost two years' work by twelve members of the parish who have been looking at St. Paul's way forward as a parish, Choir School, and Harvard Catholic Center. More to come! I am very grateful to Deacon Tim for taking on these important responsibilities.

In addition to their wonderful service to the parish, Fr. Patrick and Fr. George have been very busy serving the students and young professionals in the area with retreats, lectures, personal outreach and many other things. We are all grateful to them for their generous ministry.

As soon as all the plaster dries on the new capitals and walls, we will be able to finish painting. Following that, we will install new LED lighting in the ceiling oculi, and re-adjust the existing lighting, all serving the church's new look to best effect. The final touch will be the addition of the number and title of each of the Stations of the Cross, placed on the bar at the base of each Station. (I hope you like the work we have done with the statues of St. Paul, St. Peter, St. Patrick, St. Joseph, and Our Lady. We are keeping Isaiah and the Sacred Heart as is, because they are pretty perfect!)

Please continue to pray for our 20 friends who will be received into the church at the Easter Vigil. Under the care of Mareike Bues and Fr. Patrick, our RCIA program has been one of marquee quality, and those preparing for the sacraments have been an inspiration to us all.

As to enhancing our Easter celebration, envelopes for Easter flowers are available in the vestibule, and we are happy to memorialize or honor any person for/by whom the Brass Ensemble is donated. We hope you will be able to decorate the church for Easter on Saturday, April 20, at 9:30am.
