ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT

Today is the day! For the past few months, St. Paul's clergy and volunteers have been making calls, handing out brochures, mailing letters, and requesting times to meet and discuss the many components of this important capital campaign.

Today is Commitment Weekend for St. Paul's *Inspiring Hope: From One Generation to the Next* anniversary campaign, the date by which every family has been asked to support this campaign.

This spring, St. Paul's has raised \$\$1,398,400 toward this incredible effort from just the first 54 gifts. Our goal has been to raise \$2.5 million and we hope we can get there today through your generosity.

As a reminder, *Inspiring Hope* is designed to:

- Fund restoration and repair work to the interior of our church.
- Improve gathering and meeting spaces in our main building for use by parish ministries, religious education programs, Harvard and choir school students, and others.
- Implement improvements to the lower church that will enable that space to be readily used by all constituents in our growing community.
- Seed funding for a future expansion project to take place over the coming years.
- Support our community by tithing a portion of what we raise to Catholic Charities and Catholic Education in our region.
