ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the “Olea Sancta” Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses). Please plan on coming to pray. Also, If you could sign up for an hour a week, or once a month, that would be great. Please contact the main office or see the sign up sheet at the Church entrance. We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

This campaign seeks to raise \$2.5 million to preserve our historic campus in honor of the 100th anniversary of our Church on Bow and Arrow Streets in 2023, and the 150th anniversary of our parish in 2025.

Through *Inspiring Hope: From One Generation to the Next*, St. Paul's will be able to:

- Fund restoration and repair work to the interior of our church.
- Improve gathering and meeting spaces in our main building for use by parish ministries, religious education programs, Harvard and choir school students, and others.
- Implement improvements to the lower church that will enable that space to be readily used by all constituents in our growing community.
- Seed funding for a future expansion project to take place over the coming years.
- Support our community by tithing a portion of what we raise to Catholic Charities and Catholic Education in our region.

All parishioners are invited to attend a very special reception regarding this campaign to fund improvements in our church.

These receptions will be held on **Wednesday, May 15 and Tuesday, May 28, both at 7:00pm in DiGiovanni Hall.** These will be informational receptions on the campaign and offer a chance to join the campaign as potential volunteers.
