**ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT**

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

**Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses).** Please plan on coming to pray.

We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

# THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Dear Friends,

We continue a beautiful series of Sunday Masses dedicated to the mysteries of our faith. Today is Trinity Sunday, and, like all the mysteries, it is about love. I encourage you to go to the Catechism of the Catholic Church and read the section on the Trinity!

This week, we had extensive interviews with the five finalists for the position of Music Director here at St. Paul's. As we know, this is an important moment in the life of the parish and the Choir School. The quality of all the applicants was very impressive, as well as their care for the mission here. (One gentleman even flew up from Washington, DC for his auditions on the same day his wife was to give birth!) Each person met for an hour with me, an hour with Dr. Haferd (Head of School), twice with the Search Committee, an organ audition and then time with the Choir Boys and the Men's Scholar. When the entire process comes to a finish and the job has been offered and accepted, we will pass along the good news.

We had another opportunity last week to support the Inspiring Hope Capital Campaign. Five new pledges came in, totaling \$24,000. We are grateful to those who have participated and look forward to 100% participation from parishioners and friends of St. Paul's. Given the impact of summer here in our parish, we will offer a second round for participation in late September/early October. That said, I am happy to answer any questions, meet with any persons, and receive any pledges throughout the next few months. Thanks to all for the support!

The Parish Finance Council met this week. We are putting the finishing touches on the budget for next year and preparing to close the books for the end of this financial year. As you are well aware, finances are always a challenge for the parish, the Choir School and the Harvard Catholic Center. I am grateful to the committee members who give so much time helping to steer the ship, and to those whose financial support keep our ministries alive. We keep a very lean budget here, but need to increase our intake so that our outreach can flourish.

This week, Fr. Patrick is away for a few days for more training and formation in the critical work of campus ministry. Seminarian Bobby LeBlanc is with the other Boston seminarians for a retreat. Fr. George is with his religious community for their annual meeting, and I am in and out with some outside parish commitments. A scheduling marathon, but we've made it work! Thanks to the staff and a visiting priest for their help.

I hope that the good weather gives you some time for extra prayer, sunshine, reading and relaxing with friends.

The most needed items currently are coffee, tea, mayonnaise, nuts, trail mix, dried or canned fruit, canisters of oats, cereal (other than plain Cheerios), crackers, pancake mix, milk (including almond or other non-dairy varieties), juice, and quinoa or similar grains. We assist several people who need low sodium or low sugar items so we try to offer options that meet their dietary needs.
