ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses). Please plan on coming to pray. We need at least two people for each hour. This is a real blessing for the mission of the Parish, the Harvard Catholic Center and the Choir School.

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is yet another opportunity for us to delve with gratitude into all that God does for us. In the gift of the Eucharist, Jesus makes present to us the fullness of who He is, Body and Blood pouring out His humanity and divinity for our sake. We are blessed to celebrate the Holy Mass at least seventeen times each week at our parish, along with regular Eucharistic Adoration, and the blessing of having the chapel and church open for daily prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

We were very pleased this past week to sponsor our first ever Music and Theater Camp, organized and staffed through the Choir School. Boys and girls from age 4 to 12 enjoyed learning many aspects of these fine arts. I was particularly happy that many of the staff members were alumni of the Choir School. We look forward to the camp being a regular offering each summer. **And speaking of the Choir School, we are happy to audition and interview any new students over the course of the summer.** We have found that it is not unusual for families who are moving into the area to still be making decisions about schooling for their children. If you or someone you know might still be searching for the right place for a musically able, academically serious boy who would flourish in a Catholic all boy environment, we would be glad to hear from them!

I want to let everyone know about two things regarding Mass locations here at St. Paul's. As has been the practice for many years, the majority of the Masses will be in DiGiovanni Hall from June 29 until August 30 (in welcome air-conditioned relief!) **This year, during the first two weeks of July, the church will be completely closed so that we can refinish the wood on the aisle floors. ALL Masses will be in DiGiovanni Hall the first two weeks of July.**

Take a little extra time to go to a daily Mass or to pray in front of the Blessed Sacrament this week. The Master is there, and He is calling you!

FOOD PANTRY

The food pantry does not slow down for the summer so your continued support is always appreciated. Thank you to all who helped to replenish our supply of salad dressing, ketchup, and barbecue sauce. The most needed items currently are coffee, tea, mayonnaise, nuts, trail mix, dried or canned fruit, canisters of oats, cereal (other than plain Cheerios), crackers, pancake mix, milk (including almond or other non-dairy varieties), juice, and quinoa or similar grains. We assist several people who need low sodium or low sugar items so we try to offer options that meet their dietary needs. Ethnic foods are also welcome as our guests come from many different cultures.
