ANOINTING OF THE SICK SACRAMENT

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

Those who are facing surgeries or very serious health issues can see the priest after the Mass. The Anointing will take place near the Statue of Mary at the front left of the Church. The oils are reserved in the "Olea Sancta" Repository (Holy Oils) near the Baptismal Font. Family and friends are most welcome to be present together during the Anointing.

Every Friday, in the Parish Center Chapel, there is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 8:30am-12:00pm (between the two daily Masses). Please plan on coming to pray. THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

As previously announced, we are in another phase of our repair and renovations in the church. The wooden aisles down the center, sides and front of the church interior are being stripped, sanded, and varnished. It's been over 25 years since the floors have received any attention! (The floors beneath the pews will not be treated, as that is a job beyond our present resources.) It is a full two-week project.

THEREFORE, ALL MASSES WILL BE IN DIGIOVANNI HALL FROM JUNE 29 TO JULY 12. After that time, we will

continue the parish's long-standing practice of most summer Masses taking place in DiG Hall. More on that to come. (At some of the Masses in DiGiovanni Hall, seating will be a little tight so plan to come early!) During these weeks of the church's closure, Saturday Confessions will take place in the Chapel of the Women Doctors of the Church in the Parish Center from 3:00pm-4:30pm.

I want to welcome so many people who are with us for the summer or are beginning longer stays in the Harvard Square area. Your presence is a blessing to us. If there is something we can do for you, please do not hesitate to speak with anyone on the staff. I would also invite anyone who would like to help as a lector, Eucharistic Minister, altar server or usher during your time here to reach out to us. We would be grateful for your participation!

I am also delighted to let you know that I have appointed a new Music Director for St. Paul's Parish and St. Paul's Choir School. After an extensive process which began with 26 resumes from around the world, our able and committed 11 person Search Committee (comprised of respected musicians, educators, parishioners, parish and school staff, and Choir School parents) entered a process that brought us to five fine finalists. Each candidate met for an hour with me, an hour with Dr. Haferd (Head of School), two hours with committee members, an organ audition and rehearsal with both the boys and the men. **The formal announcement will not be until July 1, so this is just to build the expectation!** I can assure you that this is a very happy moment for us at this important time in our history. More next week!

On a more somber note, this week we mourned the loss of our dear friend and long-time parishioner Ifeanyi Menkiti. Dr. Menkiti's warm and gracious presence was an anchor to many gatherings here for decades. His funeral Mass was a testament to his great Catholic faith and the gratitude of so many for his years of teaching, writing and service to the Harvard Square community. We offer our prayers and support to his wife, Carol, and their family. May he rest in peace.

The most needed items currently are coffee, tea, mayonnaise, nuts, trail mix, dried or canned fruit, canisters of oats, cereal (other than plain Cheerios), crackers, pancake mix, milk (including almond or other non-dairy varieties), juice, and quinoa or similar grains. We assist several people who need low sodium or low sugar items so we try to offer options that meet their dietary needs. Ethnic foods are also welcome as our guests come from many different cultures.

LIVE THE LITURGY INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

"No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God." Jesus' words may seem a bit harsh but are directly on target. The life of discipleship can be costly. Upholding the tenets of the Gospel can put us at odds, even with those most close to us. Jesus never misses an opportunity to spend time with outcasts and sinners. It matters little to him whether doing so breaks a Sabbath law. The Gospel may seem unrealistic, but it is the Gospel nonetheless. We respect the dignity of all persons, from conception to natural death. We work on behalf of justice, which calls us to be with the poor, lonely, confused, and broken. The old "eye for an eye" mentality no longer applies when it comes to dealing with those who hurt us. When Jesus asks you to follow him, will you go?
