The aisles in the church have been renovated and we are very happy with the outcome. It will not only enhance the beauty of the church, but will also protect the floors for several decades to come. We'll also be glad to be able to have the church opened everyday again for folks to visit as they like! **With the exception of the 9:30am and 11:00am Mass on Sundays, all other weekday and weekend Masses will be in DiGiovanni Hall until the end of August.**

Some of the summer projects on hand: the above mentioned church floor renovations, replacement of all the chairs in DiGiovanni Hall, installation of air conditioning for the top floor of the choir school and rectory, an architectural study of the lower church, ongoing decluttering of the lower church, repair and painting of the Choir School corridor walls, replacing the 27 year old rugs in the rectory hallways, new floor mats for church vestibule, and a number of other smaller tasks. We are excited about the upcoming year and I am so grateful to the women and men who give so much of their time and professional talent for the care of the school. FOOD PANTRY

The food pantry does not slow down for the summer so your continued support is always appreciated. Thank you to all who helped to replenish our supply of salad dressing, ketchup, and barbecue sauce. The most needed items currently are coffee, tea, mayonnaise, nuts, trail mix, dried or canned fruit, canisters of oats, cereal (other than plain Cheerios), crackers, pancake mix, milk (including almond or other non-dairy varieties), juice, and quinoa or similar grains. We assist several people who need low sodium or low sugar items so we try to offer options that meet their dietary needs. Ethnic foods are also welcome as our guests come from many different cultures.
