SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Greetings Parishioners,

With Fr. Kelly away, I will take this opportunity to fill you in on what has been happening at St. Paul's and in my ministry. In June, I spent a week at University of Mary in Bismarck, ND with the FOCUS missionaries who are there for summer training. I was able to spend some time with our Harvard team, which includes two returning missionaries (Adam and Peter) and three new women. FOCUS stands for "Fellowship of Catholic University Students," and we're blessed to have them at the Harvard Catholic Center. Through one-on-one mentoring, cultivating friendships, and leading small group Bible studies, the FOCUS missionaries play a vital role in shaping the undergraduate ministry. Since FOCUS came here seven years ago, we've had 11 Harvard graduates go on to become missionaries themselves, including three from this past year's class.

June was also a busy month for weddings; I officiated at my first wedding at Memorial Church back in May and then did four in a row on consecutive Saturdays in June. What's striking is that of those 10 individuals, four were recently baptized and confirmed as adults following major interior conversions, and one couple met here at St. Paul's. Congratulations to all of them; we are very proud of the many vocations that take root here!

With conference and wedding travels now past, I'm glad to be able to catch my breath a little during this month of July. I can't believe I'm already in my second year here; there were too many graces and memorable moments to recount!

One other program of note is faith formation. Due to the great enthusiasm generated by last year's 18 RCIA candidates and their desire to continue growing in their faith, there are now two additional groups at St. Paul's: a group for past members of RCIA to receive on-going formation (the technical term is "mystagogia") and a new faith and discussion group for all parishioners led by Deacon Tim. This is a good time to start putting word out about RCIA next year: the first session will be Saturday, September 14. **I challenge every parishioner to invite two people to consider becoming Catholic or returning to the Church!** And we already have eight signed up!

The food pantry does not slow down for the summer so your continued support is always appreciated. Thank you to all who helped to replenish our supply of salad dressing, ketchup, and barbecue sauce. The most needed items currently are coffee, tea, mayonnaise, nuts, trail mix, dried or canned fruit, canisters of oats, cereal (other than plain Cheerios), crackers, pancake mix, milk (including almond or other non-dairy varieties), juice, and quinoa or similar grains.
