Dear Friends,

This may well be the last “summer” bulletin letter, as we shift into high gear at the end of August. So, rather than catch you up on everything that is happening, I will keep it brief and allow for a final summer’s deep breath. The one practical thing to announce is that **beginning next weekend, August 31/September 1, ALL MASSES will once again be in the church.**

One point for thought and prayer: there was some media attention these past weeks speaking to a study that found that only one in three Catholics believes in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. I would draw your attention to the fine article in *The Pilot* this past week by columnist (and Harvard grad) Jaymie Stuart Wolfe. Among other fine points, she notes: “Those who believe that Eucharist is merely a symbol, merely a ritual - a “something” and not a Someone miss the entire point.... He formed the Church around the gift of His Body and Blood. If we want to renew the faith of the Church today, we must begin and end where He did: with Holy Eucharist.”

I hope that all who join us here at St. Paul’s for Mass, for Eucharistic Adoration, and for quiet prayer before the tabernacle come to the deep and saving knowledge of Love that is the truth of the Eucharist: Body and Blood, humanity, soul and divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ.
