EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

The first American member of my Order, the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales, Canon J. Francis Tucker, had been airdropped into Monaco to be the chaplain to Prince Rainier; and as matchmaker, his second try was Princess Grace. As a result, we still have, besides the chaplaincy, the largest parish in the principality, St Charles.

Thus, studying theology in Rome and awaiting a summer deacon assignment, I found myself assigned by Fr. General to Monte Carlo, both parish and chaplaincy. Diaconia of course means service and having pictured an inner-city internship, I found myself asking who was serving whom: would it be more tourism than devotion to peoples' needs? I discussed this with my classmate in theology, Paul Gallagher, who got me a competing offer from his archbishop, in Liverpool. St. Swithin's, Gillmoss where I was sent, was indeed demanding. The second week I was there they burned down two rooms of the school, the third week I apprehended one of three men breaking into the rectory. The responding police took the burglar away with me next to him in the back seat proudly carrying Crown Evidence: one of the purloined frozen chickens, defrosting on my lap!


Paul Gallagher was at the English College and that next year apparently told his rector, Msgr. Cormac Murphy-O'Connor, of my Order having no ordination nearby. The Venerable English College sang every St. George's day at the basilica of San Giorgio in Velabro and so Cormac called that church's incumbent, Sergio Cardinal Pignedoli, asking him to ordain me when they came to sing his Mass. I've never quite gotten over Paul and Cormac's kindness, so far beyond the call of duty. Paul, unflappable, has ended up as the Vatican Foreign Secretary, (living where Julius II did!) Cormac, beloved, became Cardinal Archbishop of Westminster. God Bless Them Both!

The Velabrum is the oldest part of Rome, where Romulus and Remus came to shore for meals on wheels by the she-wolf; also the site of St. Sebastian's arrowed martyrdom. San Giorgio in Velabro was the church of John Henry Cardinal Newman, the 19th century churchman, man of letters, and author of *The Idea of a University*, after whom our Newman centers are named. Leader of the Oxford Movement, Oxford don and Oxford University chaplain at Great St. Mary's, drawn gradually to Catholicism, Newman costingly resigned his positions and two years later on October 9, 1845 entered the Catholic Church. Soon to be sainted, that date will be his feast day. Interestingly for us here at the Harvard Catholic Center, in the building Fr. Boles built, that was the very date that our late Pastor-Chaplain, Bishop John Boles went home to God. God Bless Him Mightily!

Cardinal Newman is rumored soon to become a doctor of the church. More important here is our Chapel of the Women Doctors of the Church inside our main building. Let us profit from their wisdom and ask their intercession!
