Dear Friends,

Thanks to all who participated in last week's Mass of the Holy Spirit, asking God's blessing on the academic year for St. Paul's Choir School, Harvard University and the other institutions of learning so wonderfully represented here. It was a pleasure to have Bishop Reed with us. It was also a treat to have a beautiful arrangement of one of Choir School founder's Theodore Marier's hymns, composed by new Music Director James Kennerley. The grand tradition of so many years carries on!

With that, I would like to invite you to a reception next Sunday, September 22, at which we will formally welcome James and his wife and son to the community. It will follow the 11:00am Mass and will take place in DiGiovanni Hall. I hope that you can join us.

This week, we will also be resuming our Thursday evening Vespers at 5:30pm. The Boys Choir leads this beautiful 25 minute service in the church. We want to expand and encourage participation at this time of prayer. Please come for yourself and bring others with you!

The Inspiring Hope Campaign is coming down to its final weeks. This weekend, we plan to have parishioners give a final word of encouragement to all so that every single parishioner might have the opportunity to support this work, in ways both large and small. On the final weekend of September, we will take the time at Mass to once again fill out Pledge Forms. I am grateful for 2.1 million dollars that has been pledged through the generosity of 150 people. I want to thank you for your participation in last week's second collection which raised needed help for the health care of active and retired priests. There was also a terrific event at the Seaport Convention Center on Thursday, attended by over 1,500 people for the same cause. I am truly grateful.

I sit on the Board for Religious, Spiritual and Ethical Life at Harvard. We had our first meeting of the academic year this week. There is better accounting these days of the importance of the interior life of students for their overall health and development. Please pray for the good fruit of this work.

Our Parish Council serves an important role for us here at St. Paul's. It is a much-valued advisory group to me, representing well the many constituents of our parish. This year, three long-serving members will be finishing up their time on the council. I would like to thank Paul Haley, Phil Kao, and Christopher Casani, who has also ably filled the role of Chairperson of the Council. If you would be interested in serving on the Council, I would be happy to speak with you. Final decisions will be made by mid-November.

### NEW TESTAMENT GREEK CLASSES: JOINT OFFERING OF ST. PAUL'S AND ST. PETER'S

**The Beginner's Class:** On **Monday evenings 7:00pm-8:00 pm beginning September 23**, this introductory course in New Testament Greek is offered for its fourth consecutive year. Lift the veil of translations and experience directly the inspired words of the New Testament! We will start with the alphabet and work up to short passages from the Gospels, stressing the sound of the language through reading aloud. The Fall term class will run until December 16.

**New Testament Greek Reading Course:** *Galatians, 1 Corinthians, and Selected Gospel Parallels.* On Tuesday evenings 7:00pm-8:00pm, the first and third Tuesdays of the month beginning on October 1, join a course in readings from St. Paul's letters and from the Gospels. Experience these vivid and compelling texts in their original language! We will provide for some Greek language review while focusing on reading and translation of the text. Participants should have completed a year of either New Testament or Classical Greek. The Fall term class will run until December 17.

**Both courses** will take place in the St. Peter's Parish Center, 100 Concord Avenue, Cambridge. Teachers are Classical languages instructor Michael O'Brien of St. Peter's and Deacon Tim O'Donnell of St. Paul's. There is no charge, and texts/ learning materials will be distributed or are available online. There is plentiful parking (enter by Manasses Ave.) and the location is served by buses 72, 74, 75, and 78.
