This weekend, the whole church is grateful to Almighty God for the life and legacy of St. John Henry Newman, canonized in Rome this weekend. Because of the importance of his intellectual life for the church, his extraordinary example as a parish priest, his compassion for all those in need, and his role as patron saint for many institutions of higher learning, we have commissioned an icon of our new saint which will be placed in our church (location to be determined). We are very excited to unveil and bless it at Mass this week. Again, my gratitude to Chip Piatti for steering this project to completion. Be sure to read some of Newman's prayers and writings. He is often regarded as one of the best stylists in the English language. We look forward to a lecture or two on his life and work next semester. St. John Henry Newman, pray for us!

This Sunday at 3:00pm in DiGiovanni Hall, we are happy to welcome again Ben Patterson. He will offer a wonderful presentation on "St. Francis of Assisi in Art." His lectures are engaging and very informative. Come and join in for this great opportunity.

Last week, we brought our Inspiring Hope Capital Campaign: From One Generation to the Next to its public closure. With your help, just last weekend alone, we raised over \$100,000! Thank you! This brought us to just over 2.2 million dollars. Of course, you are still most welcome to participate by speaking with one of the staff or reaching out to the Parish Office.
