## TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

**Last weekend, we celebrated two events of artistic note.** First, we unveiled the icon of St. John Henry Newman which was designed here at St. Paul's and "written" exclusively for our church. We look forward to installing it permanently before Christmas. We also enjoyed the lecture by Ben Patterson regarding St. Francis of Assisi and his depiction in art. I should add that the number of lectures and continuing education opportunities offered here at the parish are a testimony to the level of interest among our members and the deep well of knowledge that is part of our church's history. So glad that so many take advantage of these things...and thanks to those who make them happen.

**During the month of October, we always do a "count" of parishioners at each Mass.** This helps with planning on any number of levels. It also reminds me that each one of us has the responsibility and privilege of inviting others to be with the Lord. We have so much to offer at St. Paul's. Please invite folks to come with you to Mass or to join us for Eucharistic Adoration or Vespers or Confession or perhaps a few quiet moments in the stillness. When we bring someone to the Lord, He will do the rest!

**As indicated above, we have resumed our Thursday Choral Evening Vespers at 5:30pm.** The Boys Choir leads this beautiful 25 minute service in the church. Please come yourself and bring others with you! It's a perfect moment in the day to pause, to reflect, and to pray. We have seen a steady increase in attendance. One woman said last Thursday: "It was the best moment of my week." You can also join a long running celebration of Vespers in the Chapel of the Women Doctors in our Parish Center at 6:00pm on Mondays and Wednesdays.

**We will soon finish the upgrade of lighting in the church sanctuary.** This work allows for more environmentally sound practices, and also helps to highlight more effectively the beautiful elements of the front of our church. This is part of the church restoration funded by our *Inspiring Hope* Campaign. (If you've not had a chance to do so, you are still free to be part of it!)

**Our Parish Council serves an important role for us here at St. Paul's.** It is a much-valued advisory group to me, representing well the many constituents of our parish. If you would be interested in serving on the Council, I would be happy to speak with you. Final decisions will be made by mid-November.

**Please pray for our undergraduates who are on retreat this weekend.** They will be guided by St. John Paul II's timely and timeless "Theology of the Body." May God draw them closer and lead them forward!

**Throughout October, the church throughout the United States celebrates "Pro Life Month."** It's a chance for us to celebrate, reflect and pray about the profound and seamless teaching of the Church regarding the dignity of every person, a message needed now perhaps more than ever. With homilies, rosaries, Eucharistic Adoration, outreach to those in need and printed materials, we re-commit ourselves once again to Jesus' promise that we may have life, and life in abundance.
