THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

My Dear Friends,

The church is proud of its new saint, John Henry Newman, and so, as a Newman Center, are we too - as our new icon of Cardinal Newman attests! In founding a Catholic University for Ireland, Newman contributed mightily to its church and of course his memoir in that whole challenge, *The Idea of a University*, is dear to us all.

Newman's earlier influence as chaplain to Oxford at Great St. Mary's is hard to overstate. Further, as Oxford don, it was his decision to focus on his students' entire welfare beyond just their studies that had them removed from his care by the contrary-minded provost of his college, granting Newman the spare time to study the Fathers to understand better Christ's church...wherein he read himself right into the Catholic one!

It was thus apt to have the Ed School's College President in Residence, Dr. Jim Mullen of Allegheny College in Pennsylvania join us for a Faculty Fireside Chat last Tuesday. He underscored Popes John's & Francis' influence in his own life and work in trying to reach out to the world and let the joy and hope of the Gospel ring out anew in the hearts of all we meet. President Mullen's rules of thumb were a précis of pastoral theology too long forgotten. Reach out to people where they're "at," with warmth more than rigidity, opening windows to let in new insights and share perennial truths in new ways, respect their vulnerability by treating them less by judgment than by mercy: God's other name!

The Wall St. Journal Friday two weeks ago had an op-ed by Catholic University's President John Garvey, a delightful mention of two saints: Francis de Sales and John Henry Newman. Noting that DeSales' line "Heart Speaks to Heart" became the motto, "Cor ad Cor Loquitur" in Cardinal Newman's coat of arms, his WSJ article singled them both out as saints of friends, each possessed of vast correspondence to their large circles. Friendships are precisely what students seem to need more and more, particularly grad students in their more isolated situation. Thus, besides our Grad Students and Young Professionals Monthly Dinners we have just sponsored, by the ingenious postering of Becky McGill, "Wine and Cheese for PhD's" as a time and space for friendship's birth.

Thanks to Ben Bellett, we have mightily re-established the post-9:30am Mass Sunday Grad Student (and Young Professionals) Brunch: "Low Brunch for the Higher Faculties," so that graduate and professional schools' students can encounter each other.

Friendships are precisely what we and all our students need. Looking back to the remarkable influence of friends like you in my own life I must recall a theology classmate (now Archbishop Paul R. Gallagher, the Vatican Foreign Secretary) and college rector, (become Cormac Cardinal Murphy-O'Connor of Westminster) who, leading like the kindly light they shine, saw to my Ordination in Rome. The ordination church where the Venerable English College celebrated at the same time St. George's day was San Giorgio in Velabro, St. John Henry Newman's very church in Rome as cardinal! (The Velabrum is also famous as the spot where Romulus & Remus found meals on wheels provided by the she-wolf.)

Often do we use Newman's phrase at funerals; let us ever pray it for each other: "May He support us all the day long till the shadows lengthen and the evening comes and the busy world is hushed and the fever of life is over and our work is done. Then in His Mercy may He give us a safe lodging and a holy rest and peace at last."
