Dear Friends,

What a great success the Oktoberfest was last week! The music, sauerkraut and German Chocolate Cake was in abundance, as over 200 parishioners, aged 2 months to 92 years joined in the camaraderie and fun. Special thanks to Chris Cassani and his able assistants Bill Sullivan and Paul Haley for their preparations, and to all who helped the cleanup go smoothly and quickly. Danke!

Last week, we brought our *Inspiring Hope Capital Campaign: From One Generation to the Next* to its public closure. I want to thank all those who donated and helped us over the \$2 million mark. I will give a final tally when the results are in. *Of course, you are still most welcome to participate by speaking with one of the staff or reaching out to the Parish Office.* Remember that to pledge a dollar a week over five years would contribute \$1800 to our work here! Special thanks to Paul Cravedi who coordinated much of the Campaign and also was present at each Mass last weekend helping with the Pledge Forms.

The Liturgy Committee met last week, and had the opportunity to have a great conversation with James Kennerley, our new Music Director and its newest member. We looked ahead to many important celebrations and gave attention to on-going needs as we continue to provide for people from all over the world a place of reverent worship. I am grateful for the members' input and commitment. Just this weekend, we have 3 weddings, two baptisms, First Saturday Anointing of the Sick and 8 Masses (not to mention the Blessing of the Animals!)

Also, we have resumed our Thursday Choral Evening Vespers at 5:30. The Boys Choir leads this beautiful 25 minute service in the church. We want to expand and encourage participation at this time of prayer. Please come for yourself and bring others with you! It's a perfect moment in the day to pause, to reflect, and to pray. You can also join a long running celebration of Vespers in the Chapel of the Women Doctors in our Parish Center at 6:00 on Mondays and Wednesdays.

Our Parish Council serves an important role for us here at St. Paul's. It is a much-valued advisory group to me, representing well the many constituents of our parish. This year, three long-serving members will be finishing up their time on the council. I would like to thank Leslie McCarthy, Paul Haley, Phil Kao, and Christopher Cassani, who has also ably filled the role of Chairperson of the Council. If you would be interested in serving on the Council, I would be happy to speak with you. Final decisions will be made by mid-November.

Our RCIA program is off to a great start and last week our High School Confirmation Program began. It is not too late to sign up for either program. (This would be a reminder, too, that applications for our Choir School are still open, as well as for our Religious Education Program!) If you are interested, please contact the responsible staff person, listed in our bulletin.

Finally, the whole church is grateful to Almighty God for the life and legacy of St. John Henry Newman, canonized in Rome this weekend. Because of the importance and courage of his intellectual life for the church, his extraordinary example as a parish priest, his compassion for all those in need, and his role as patron saint for many institutions of higher learning, we have commissioned an icon of our new saint which will be placed in our church (location to be determined.) If it has arrived on time from the "Writer" of the icon in Bulgaria, it will be unveiled at Masses next week. St. John Henry Newman, pray for us!

If you are a faith-filled Catholic man, single or a sacramentally married, who would love to serve Christ and the Church as a minister of Charity, Word and Sacrament, you may be discerning God's call to the Permanent Diaconate. **Saint Paul's is offering Session 1** of a 3 session Diaconate Inquirers Program **October 7, 2019** at 7pm, in the Boles Room, **hosted by Deacon Tim O'Donnell**. If married you are strongly encouraged to attend with your wife. **This first session** will discuss **"Who is the deacon?"**, and address any questions you may have regarding the role and work of the deacon in the Church and community. The Diaconate Formation Program is 4 years in length and is open to single and married men who will be between the ages of 35 and 65 at the time of ordination. The session is open to all inquirers without registration, including **any who may be interested in the diaconate ultimately in a different diocese**.
