Dear Friends,

What a good and full weekend we had last week. Our Parish Choir provided the music for a beautiful liturgy for All Souls on Saturday. Then we had Harvard Freshman Parents' Weekend, Choir School Alumni Sunday and Open House for possible students, a lecture regarding some inspiring initiatives in Bethlehem in the Holy Land, and a successful fundraising Gala for our Harvard Catholic Center-anchored EVkids (formerly Earthen Vessels), which does incredible work providing tutoring for inner city students. All this, plus continuing formation with our 29 RCIA candidates, religious education for our children, and Masses, baptisms and confessions. (I felt like hiding out in the Bouncy House we had set up in the inner courtyard!) Please continue to pray for all those involved in the activities noted above.

As you know, November is a month when we offer particular prayers for our deceased loved ones and for those who have no one to pray for them. A part of our commemoration at St. Paul's, we will have a Mass on this Friday, November 15 at 5:00pm (the early start time is because of a schedule conflict in the church!) The special feature of this Mass is the famous Fauré Requiem sung by our Choir of Boys and Men. This is always one of my favorite events here at St. Paul's each year, and I hope that you can join us, and invite someone to come along with you.

Parish Council work continues, and we are still open to receiving nominations for new members. The Liturgy Committee will also be looking ahead to Advent and other liturgical celebrations coming up in the near future. Time marches on. Also, thanks to our St. Vincent de Paul Society group who are meeting to make plans for their continued good work.

I hope you enjoy the new lighting in the sanctuary. Not only are the LED fixtures more environmentally sophisticated, but they also provide a wider and warmer glow to highlight the beautiful architecture there. This is part of the Inspiring Hope Campaign restoration project, so thank you!

This Sunday, November 10, the boys will not be singing at the 11:00am Mass so that their families can enjoy a well-deserved long weekend. Our excellent Men's Schola will be leading us in song. Have a blessed week.
