We are looking forward to **this Sunday afternoon** at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross, when parishioner **Judy Beatrice will receive the Cheverus Award from Cardinal Seán**, along with many other deserving recipients from throughout the Archdiocese. She joins distinguished company of past recipients from St. Paul's: Sam DeMerit, Chip Piatti and Mary Martell. We still have a few spots available on the (school!) bus, which will depart from Mt. Auburn Street at 1:00pm and return about 4:30pm. Come along to support this wonderful occasion (and to see the renovated cathedral!)

This is a good week at the Choir School as well. On Thursday evening, the Vigil of one of our Patronesses, St. Cecilia, three of our boys were elevated to **Head Chorister** status. This holds with it a number of responsibilities. I am delighted with this new part of our program, as it calls boys to leadership in new ways.
