## THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Greetings from your Parochial Vicar & Undergraduate Chaplain!

Besides Holy Week and graduation time, I think it's safe to say that September-October is the busiest time of year for me: planning for the upcoming school year, welcoming events at the beginning of the semester, getting RCIA up and running, and planning the undergrad fall retreat. And I am happy to report here on each of those.

First of all, this fall was an entirely different experience for me compared to the previous year: no longer being "the new guy in town" afforded me the freedom to think more methodically about outreach and event planning. With RCIA, a group of new volunteers from last year's class has stepped up to run the program with me and thus build further upon last year's success. We currently have 24 candidates preparing for sacraments! Thus far the candidates have had lectures from Fr. Kelly, Deacon Tim, myself, and special guests Professor Adrian Vermeule (Harvard Law) and Dr. Sarah Beyers (Boston College).

Two weeks ago at the undergraduate fall retreat we enjoyed picture-perfect fall weather in Maine, and traveled "Back to Eden" by exploring themes of St. John Paul II's *Theology of the Body*. The art and media saturated talks were given by nationally renowned presenter, Bill Donaghy from the Theology of the Body Institute. He touched on broad anthropological themes such as wonder, beauty, contemplation, creation, relationships, human love and *eros*. Like the general purpose of *Theology of the Body*, the goal of the retreat was not so much to resolve particular ethical issues but rather to ground oneself in the Christian anthropology needed to adequately address them. At the end of the weekend, I announced the leader of the spring retreat: Sr. Ann Kateria CFR, who is a graduate of Harvard College, class of 1999. She will be preaching on Christian joy.

Finally, many of you have been asking me, "When's the next *Vatican III* show??" Unfortunately I have none to report for the immediate future! With our lower church renovations beginning soon, that space will be unavailable for use. But *perhaps* we might put on a show there to celebrate it's re-opening next fall. So stay tuned!
