SEVENTH SUNDAY ORDINARY IN TIME

An English vicar had sadly lost his zeal for pastoral work, spending his time out gadding, everywhere but the parish. Aware that the bishop suspected him of this, he cunningly named his horse "Ministry," so that his housekeeper could explain, should His Lordship visit, that the vicar "was away, on 'Ministry'." [Can you believe it?!] Recalled some time ago in The Times of London, there soon came a letter to its editor from the then Archbishop of Westminster, George Basil Hume, with the spiritual insight one expects of a Benedictine abbot: "If he has lost his life's purpose, perhaps he should go away...on 'Retreat'!" This is just what our law and business school students propose to do, in the height (and depth) of Holy Week, "A Retreat for the Law and Profits" as those campuses once styled it, with the rest of our grad students joining them. Please pray for them as we shall you, hoping you somehow find times way for yourselves.

Our spirituality group, Ex Libris, will soon be praying lines from the ever-jovial St Philip Neri. Ex Libris previously shared his disciple's, St John Henry Cardinal Newman's poem "The Pillar of the Cloud," which captures so well his life's, soul's and heart's journey into full light: "Lead Kindly Light, Amid the Encircling Gloom, Lead Though Me On!"

I've told some of you that my Rome classmate, long the provincial of the Augustinians in Britain, Paul Graham OSA, had driven me to see Newman's study in the Birmingham Oratory. A third of his study is partitioned off with an altar, the oil painting of a saint above the altar, etchings of scenes of the saint's life on that partition wall. Pointing at the oil I said, "That's St. Francis de Sales!" "You're daft George, St Philip Neri is their founder!" "Yes he is, but that's St Francis de Sales!" And indeed it was, and all the prints on the wall, scenes from de Sales' life and so labeled. The Oratory now calls the room the Chapel of St Francis de Sales. He was Newman's greatest patron. Newman took the motto for his episcopal arms from deSales: "Cor ad Cor Loquitur," "heart speaks to heart." If Newman had an unparalleled impact of Vatican Council II, DeSales had his role in both Vatican I & II.

It was the surprise of a lifetime that the Venerable English College, Rome, provided my ordination at, of all places, St John Henry Cardinal Newman's titular church in Rome, San Giorgio in Velabro. The Velabrum is where Rome began, where Romulus and Remus came to shore for 'meals on wheels' by the she-wolf, also where St Sebastian was tied to a tree and struck by arrows. The church is famed in movies to suggest the earliest of churches.

My classmate Paul R Gallagher and Cormac Cardinal Murphy-O'Connor asked Sergio Pignedoli to ordain me when the English College arrived to sing there for St George's Day. Cormac, God Rest Him, became Archbishop of Westminster, Paul, is the current Vatican foreign secretary, his rooms in the oldest part of the Vatican were those of Julius II. He has and uses his desk! (And I thought Bow & Arrow Streets were old!). Speaking of kind saints: Thanks for all the good you do!

We have been singing the Salve Regina at Mass here to pray for the safety of the Choir School community on their Germany-Austria Tour and for its success, along with them in spirit..

Some have missed the J H Newman icon Fr Kelly has put up in the church: if you sit behind the transept, do venture forth and turn right - big as life. Our students and young adults are going on Vocation Retreats - for women and men - this weekend. Do pray for them. Do allow yourself time for a retreat, however brief. Visit the Chapel of the Women Doctors of the Church that Fr Kelly made striking, just inside our parish building. Pray their great lines which enabled their great lives which are painted on the Chapel's wall.

We get to know our customers and their preferences rather than handing them a prepacked bag of items that they will never use (some even bring us unwanted items from other food pantries). Because we do not receive food from the Greater Boston Food Bank, we are not subject to the requirements and restrictions that limit their use of other food pantries. The current priority list includes coffee (regular, decaf, instant), flavored tea, cereal, oatmeal (instant packets and canisters of oats), shelf stable milk and almond milk, salad dressing, honey, dried fruit, and nuts.
