FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Greetings all!

With St. Paul's Choir School and Fr. Kelly just returning from Germany and Austria, I am happy to be taking the column this week. We begin once again the great "Season of 40 Days," or *Quadragesima*, as it is known in Latin. Lent is the preeminent time of year to "step up our game" and engage more intentionally in acts of prayer, penance, and charity. Thankfully there are no shortage of opportunities in and around St. Paul's to do that.

I want to encourage everyone in a particular way to consider coming to Mass during the week as well as going to confession *twice* before Easter. We are blessed with such a vibrant daily Mass congregation here at St. Paul's; we have as many as 50 people at each of our 8:00am and 12:10pm Masses. Everyone who attends can testify that it grounds their day unlike any other practice. Daily Mass is also a concrete way of centering one's day around Christ as well as truly making the Eucharist the "source and summit" of our lives, as the Church teaches. I can almost guarantee that frequent reception of Holy Communion combined with monthly confession (or more) will bring about a deeper intimacy with the Lord Jesus and a greater outpouring of the gifts of the Holy Spirit in your life!

Last weekend I and 22 undergraduates returned to Kennebunk, Maine for our spring retreat. Our special guest presenter was Sr. Ann Kateri (Harvard College '99) and Sr. Joseph from the CFR Sisters, based in New York and New Jersey. Aside from their powerful talks, just their personal witness alone taught us all so much about authentic Christian joy.

We're blessed to have two more religious sisters in town this week - Sr. Maria Veritas (Harvard College 2010) and Sr. Joseph Andrew from the Dominican Sisters of Mary Mother of the Eucharist. We have kept them plenty busy with talks and presentations for various groups through the Parish and Center!

Please continue to pray for the perseverance and ongoing interior conversion of the 26 candidates preparing for full reception into the Catholic Church this Easter. It's been another grace-filled (and record-breaking!) year for RCIA.
