Dear Friends,

I hope you are doing okay in these hot days! There is so much to pray for in our world, country, St. Paul's community and our own families. Let's support one another in that way! We're very happy to celebrate this week baptisms, a wedding, First Communion, and next week, High School Confirmation. The more things change, the more they remain the same!

The painting phase in the church sanctuary has commenced. At this writing, with the plaster just dried, we are plotting the course. I will have a better sense by next week of a timeline. As I mentioned earlier, there was more damage to the decorative rosettes on the sanctuary ceiling than originally expected, so many had to be replaced. This will impact the cost and time of painting, but when it is completed, it will be beautiful!

There is much work being done in the choir school. We are at full tilt with six or seven projects underway. Our small Music Camp for interested boys and girls in the area begins Monday, August 17, and then the choir school opens in phases the following week. As you can imagine, the logistics of returning to school in the Covid time are enormous. Enrollment has increased and is still open! We owe tremendous thanks to Dr. Haferd, Head of School, and his staff. We've also been blessed with a committed Parents' Guild and a special "Re-Entry Team" consisting of doctors, lawyers, educators, building professionals and educators.

The ministry team for our Harvard students and young professionals is in place, and preparations are ready for students both present on campus and those who will be part of our community online. Please keep all the work of the Harvard Catholic Center in your prayers.

Over the next few weeks, we will be closing out our participation in the 2020 Catholic Appeal. It has been a rough year for this project, but St. Paul's, as usual, has stepped up in an admirable way. Thanks for your help with this. Along that line, you are still welcome to participate in the *90 Days Now Initiative* to support the parish. This will be given extra value, as a Boston family has promised to add to each parish's pledge when the diocesan total reaches \$450,000. Please join in by going to the website!

Beginning this Monday, August 17, the daily 12:10pm Mass will no longer be in DiGiovanni Hall, but will be in the church. (There is no 8:00am Mass for the time being.) This will allow for the Music Camp and for preparations for the beginning of the Choir School year. (For those reading this online Friday, we will have one **Mass for the Feast of the Assumption. It will be at 9:00am on Saturday, August 15 in the church.**)

As we carry on in these unprecedented times, I would like to remind you to remain vigilant with protocols when you come to Mass. If you are not feeling well, please do not come to church. If you have been travelling, please take the necessary precautions. Please sanitize your hands before you arrive. Be sure to have a face covering. No congregational singing. Follow the directives of the ushers. (In the event that ushers are fewer than anticipated, please follow distancing procedures as you would in any public place, like a supermarket.) With that, we are always happy for more help with cleaning, ushering, and Eucharistic Ministers.

Being strong is important these days, but let's not lose the inner truth. The Gospel reminds us again and again that God's love is our true source of strength. On Him the strongest person can lean without apology! God bless, Fr. Kelly

ST. PAUL'S LANGUAGE WORKSHOPS

Christian Latin: 1st and 3rd Mondays Begins September 14, 7:00pm - 8:00pm

This course will survey inspiring and generally underappreciated examples of Christian prose and poetry spanning over a millennium - from the Roman Empire through the Medieval era - in the original Latin. We will start with excerpts from a pair of early saints' lives, read selections from St. Jerome's Vulgate Bible and proceed to later masterpieces, including some of the wonderful antiphons of St. Hildegard of Bingen. While there will be some language review, we will focus on reading and translation of the texts. Participants should have completed and have some recollection of a year or more of Latin. Classical languages instructor Michael O'Brien will lead this group. There is no charge, and texts and learning materials will be distributed or are available online.

New Testament Greek: 1st and 3rd Tuesday Begins September 15, 7:00pm - 8:00pm

Back for the fourth year! This year we'll be reading selections from the Gospel of St. Matthew. Experience this inspiring text in its original language! We will provide for some Greek language review while focusing on reading and translation of the text, with particular attention to passages without counterparts in the other Gospels. Participants should have completed a year of either New Testament or Classical Greek. Teachers are Classical languages instructor Michael O'Brien and Deacon Tim O'Donnell. There is no charge, and texts and learning materials will be distributed or are available online.

PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN

Per the Archdiocese of Boston, as part of serving in **ANY** ministry at St. Paul's, or any parish in the Archdiocese, Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) checks are obtained for all volunteers who minister to or have the potential for unmonitored access to children, youth, elderly or the disabled. CORI checks with a valid ID take place before you start practicing your ministry. We appreciate your help with this. In January, we learned that all volunteers are also required to **complete a VIRTUS, Protecting God's Children, training class**. In the process of obtaining more information on trainings, Covid-19 happened, and sessions had to be postponed. On a temporary basis, training is available online. VIRTUS, unlike the CORI form, only needs to be completed once and its validity spans across parishes. The training should take two hours.

All employees and all volunteers who may have contact with children continue to be required to complete Protecting God's Children training. Due to our current inability to gather together for live trainings, volunteers can currently meet this requirement through participation in two online trainings: VIRTUS online PGC training and Massachusetts online Mandated Reporter training.

To complete the online PGC training, volunteers should go to www.virtusonline.org.

Click on "First time registrant"
On the next page click on "Begin the registration process"
Select "Boston" from the drop down list of dioceses
Complete the registration process

Once registration is complete you will be directed to an [online PGC training through VIRTUS](#). Upon completion of that training, individuals will be directed to a link to an [additional online training on mandated reporting in Massachusetts](#). [Both online trainings must be completed to be in compliance with child protection requirements.](#)

Copies of the mandated reported certificates should be sent to Michelle Gee at MGee@rcab.org. It is not necessary to submit a copy of the PGC certificate.
