## TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

Print deadlines are complicated things, and because of the Labor Day holiday and other factors, I am submitting this letter almost two weeks in advance. Therefore, I will keep many specifics a little vague, as things change very often these days!! I am sure, though, that prayers for our brothers and sisters in California and in the Louisiana/Texas area are still in order. (A friend of mine recently was made Bishop of Beaumont, Texas and began his service four days before the hurricane struck. Please pray for him and his people!)

**I want to welcome all those who are new to our community.**

Be sure to reach out to any of the staff to see how you might get connected and involved in the best way possible. We are delighted to have you with us!

The painters are doing their best to finish the sanctuary. What a job! Pray for them! We are still aiming for completion by September 10.

**Next Sunday, September 13, at the 11:00am Mass, we will celebrate the annual Mass of the Holy Spirit, asking God's blessing on the academic year for Harvard, St. Paul's Choir School, and the other academic institutions represented here.**

We are very happy to be welcoming back **Fr. Bryan Hehir, former pastor of St. Paul's, who continues to serve on the Harvard faculty and as Cabinet Secretary for Social Services and Health Care for the Archdiocese of Boston as celebrant and homilist.** We also hope that a small schola from the Choir School, observing carefully all Covid related safety measures, will provide some music. If you can join us, please be sure to register for the Mass online at the parish website.

**Other important calendar notes:** as mentioned last week, we have decided not to reinstitute the daily 8:00am Mass through the spring. This is for many well-considered reasons. It is a disappointment, but I thank you for your understanding. The 12:10pm Monday-Friday Mass and 9:00am on Saturdays are still in place. Also, Saturday Confessions have not yet begun, and we will no longer have Tuesday evening Parish Confessions. We will announce a new time slot for announced parish confessions in mid-late September when construction and resettling are completed, and we have a better sense of how schedules and use of space are developing in this "new normal." Until then, you are welcome to contact a priest for confession! Again, thanks for your flexibility in these challenging days. More to come soon!

**Practical points:** please register for Mass each week, even if you had not been doing so throughout the summer. Be sure to wear your face covering. Please remember to lower your kneeler at the end of Mass so that cleaners can take care of that specific area; volunteers for ushers, cleaners, lectors, Eucharistic Ministers are always welcome; please sign up for online offertory giving; food for the Food Pantry can be left in the church vestibule during any Mass time.

I hope that you can enjoy this Labor Day holiday. Please join us for Mass that day in the church, which we will retain on the holiday schedule at 9:00am.

### ST. PAUL'S LANGUAGE WORKSHOPS

#### Christian Latin: 1st and 3rd Mondays

##### Begins September 14, 7:00pm - 8:00pm

This course will survey inspiring and generally underappreciated examples of Christian prose and poetry spanning over a millennium - from the Roman Empire through the Medieval era - in the original Latin. We will start with excerpts from a pair of early saints' lives, read selections from St. Jerome's Vulgate Bible and proceed to later masterpieces, including some of the wonderful antiphons of St. Hildegard of Bingen. While there will be some language review, we will focus on reading and translation of the texts. Participants should have completed and have some recollection of a year or more of Latin. Classical languages instructor Michael O'Brien will lead this group. There is no charge, and texts and learning materials will be distributed or are available online.

#### New Testament Greek: 1st and 3rd Tuesday

##### Begins September 15, 7:00pm - 8:00pm

Back for the fourth year! This year we'll be reading selections from the Gospel of St. Matthew. Experience this inspiring text in its original language! We will provide for some Greek language review while focusing on reading and translation of the text, with particular attention to passages without counterparts in the other Gospels. Participants should have completed a year of either New Testament or Classical Greek. Teachers are Classical languages instructor Michael O'Brien and Deacon Tim O'Donnell. There is no charge, and texts and learning materials will be distributed or are available online.

**FOOD PANTRY**

Thank you to all who have continued to support the food pantry over the past few months. We generally need at least 50 paper grocery bags each week and expect donations to decline as we return to using reusable bags. We are continuing to prioritize the following items: cereal, shelf stable milk (quart size in TetraPak containers), rice, beans, pasta, pasta sauce, peanut butter, jelly, tuna, mayonnaise, and coffee. We would also like to recognize the food rescue organizations that enable our food pantry and others in the area to provide fresh fruits and vegetables: Food for Free, Food Link, and Rescuing Leftover Cuisine. These are in addition to our longstanding relationship with Fair Foods.
