SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS

Dear Friends,

The Feast of All Saints has always been a favorite one here at St. Paul's. It is an added blessing when it falls on a Sunday, the Lord's Day, which sustained every saint and helps each of us to grow toward sainthood. Be sure to celebrate this Sunday with extra vigor!

Congratulations and prayers are in order for seminarian Bobby LeBlanc, who was ordained a deacon last Saturday by Cardinal O'Malley. What a great gift that this fine young man has been called by Christ and the church to offer his life in service for each one of us. We look forward to his ministry at the altar, to his preaching, and to his example of charity, revealing in all these Jesus' own love.

Thanks to all who participated in the All Day/All Night Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament this week as part of our celebration of the Year of the Eucharist. My experience has been that extended periods of Adoration bring a distinct aura of prayer to a church building, which effects all the parish. We chose these days purposefully in preparation for the Solemnity of All Saints, and also in protection and spiritual battle against evil spirits and occultists, for whom Halloween is a day of particular unholiness (a perverse mirror of All Saints Day.) Continue to join us on Friday mornings from 11:00am until the noon Mass for Adoration, spending special time with Our Lord.

This week, we had the wonderful occasion of **blessing and dedicating our new icon of St. John Henry Newman**, located in the right transept in the front of the church by the small organ. Designed by our recently deceased parishioner, Chip Piatti, the icon is a gift of the friends of Jack Reardon, a legend at Harvard who joins us often here for Mass and also serves on the Advisory Board of the Harvard Catholic Center. Newman is a patron saint of colleges and universities who is much beloved by the St. Paul's community and is a real hero for Jack. With gratitude and congratulations, Jack!

The good news is that more people are coming to Mass; the challenge is that we must be as vigilant and careful as possible with protocols:

- Please register for Mass, and try to be here at least five minutes early so that we can assess spacing for seating more easily.
- Please remember that masks **MUST** be worn *throughout the entire Mass*.
- You may want to wear warmer clothing and gloves as the weather gets cooler. We want to keep the windows and doors open as long as reasonably possible for good ventilation and airflow.

When the weather turns too cold for open doors/windows, each person will have to make a decision about attending Mass in church, based on one's comfort level with being in an enclosed (though large) place with others (masked and distanced) for one hour.

November is a month when we pray for our dead with particular care; All Souls Day will be celebrated with Mass at 12:10pm on Monday, November 2. Our usual Mass with the Faure *Requiem* is postponed until next year.

We have much to pray about. Please pray for our country as we come to Election Day. Also, please pray for the world as COVID 19 cases increase, for all those suffering from COVID 19, and those who care for them.

Saints of God, come to our aid! God bless, Fr. Kelly

YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST

Pope Benedict XVI reminds us of the Lord's invitation to meet Him in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament: "God has truly come to dwell among us in the Eucharist. He became flesh so that he might become bread. He gave himself to enter into the "fruit of the earth and the work of human hands"; thus he puts himself in our hands and into our hearts.
