Dear Friends,

I am afraid that because of the public nature of my e-mail address and the fact that mine is a “helping people” profession, I am often the victim of e-mail hacking. In spite of many safeguards, these folks are masters at getting around security set ups. That said, if you ever receive an e-mail from me requesting monetary or material assistance (gift cards, etc...), please consider it a false e-mail, not from me. You are welcome to phone me to double check, though you can be confident it is not from me. What a world!

Much of what is here is repeated from past weeks...all still VERY relevant!

Cardinal Seán once again is speaking passionately about the dignity of all human life, and especially in reference to the terrible legislation being proposed in the **ROE Act** here in Massachusetts regarding abortion, an Act that is rightly called **“radical in its nature and destructive in its consequences.”** Please see the brief summary here in the bulletin and the longer statement on our website. It is critical that you reach out to the Joint Committee on Judiciary at (617)722.2396 and register your concern and opposition. Also see www.macatholic.org for more information.

I am happy to announce that we will have a day long and overnight vigil for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from Friday, October 30 at 1:00pm until 8:45am on Saturday, October 31, in the church. *There will be more information coming, but we will need at least four persons who commit to cover one hour throughout the day and night. Please look ahead to your schedule and plan when might be best for you.* Confessors will also be available. It is a real grace to do this in a parish. On Saturday, October 3, we returned to the former timetable of Saturday Confessions at 3:00pm-4:30pm. Please note that the location will be the “Work Sacristy,” which is located off the right side of the sanctuary and can be accessed through the door near the small front organ. We will have more information posted. Until then, feel free to contact a priest for an appointment.

We have been giving a lot of time and attention to a new endeavor called the Harvard Catholic Forum (HFC.) I would encourage you to go to the Harvard Catholic Center website and see the Harvard Catholic Forum tab for our Mission statement and other information. Our first online event will be on *Thursday, October 15*. Upcoming speakers include scientist Stephen Barr, Biblical scholar Fr. Richard Clifford, SJ, and world respected Catholic commentator in Rome, John Allen.

As we have been mentioning at the Offertory Announcement: since Covid, our weekly collection has fallen by 35%-40%. If you can increase your weekly offering (preferably through online giving), it would be most appreciated. Many are struggling with being furloughed from work or have lost their employment. Paradoxically, others have told us that, because of Covid, they have more disposable income because some habits of eating out, travel and entertainment have been curtailed. If you find yourself in the latter category and could afford a little extra help to St. Paul’s, **it will make a great difference.**

It is very important that everyone register for Mass. At some Masses, you may not be allowed in without registration confirmation. We have an influx of people now that the school year has begun, and we still have limited space. We are happy to have a limited schola and servers (all masked and distanced) at the 9:30am and 11:00am Masses!

Practical points: when you are coming up to communion, please remember to wear your mask, to come in SINGLE FILE down the aisle with good spacing, and to return by the side aisle after going to the “blue box” to consume the Blessed Sacrament. Please sign up for online offertory giving; food for the Food Pantry can be left in the church vestibule during any Mass time, or on Saturday morning, in the courtyard under the bridgeway. And last but not least: our friend and seminarian intern, **Bobby LeBlanc, will be ordained a deacon by Cardinal Seán on Saturday, October 24 at 10:00am.** Seating is restricted because of Covid, but it can be viewed on CatholicTV. Please pray for him!

YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST

Saint Faustina lived a life centered around her love for the Eucharist. In her diary, we can learn much about her devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. Let us meditate on the prayer which Saint Faustina wrote about total self-abandonment when receiving Holy Communion: "Jesus-Host, whom I have this very moment received into my heart, in this union with you I offer myself to the Heavenly Father as a sacrificial host, abandoning myself totally and completely to the most merciful holy will of my God. From today onward, your will, Lord, is my food. You have my whole being; dispose of me as you please . . . I no longer fear any of your inspirations, nor do I probe anxiously to see where they will lead me . . . I have placed all my trust in your will which is, for me, love and mercy itself."

FOOD PANTRY
