## THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

A graduate student in a supermarket in Cambridge MA had 25 items on the belt as the cashier asked, "Are you at MIT or Harvard?" "Well, what business is that of yours?" Pointing up to the sign overhead clearly stating LIMIT 6 ITEMS! "I'm just trying to figure out whether you can't read or you can't count!"

Each professional school provides a narrowing focus, the grad school departments embody it. We live in an age of specialization. Yet the human spirit so often "wants out!" We are made for a broader vision and a wider world as Pope Francis's newest encyclical proclaims: solidarity with everyone else! We will soon be having GS/YP discussions of it. Our Environmental Group has done great work with us on Laudato Si, the previous letter. (And its leaders, Victor Champagne and Johana the Happy (l'Hereux) just got married. Papal letters are never without effect!)

Study and research, library and laboratory can be isolating; all the more for our grad students happy to be home but necessarily denied there the variety of courses and colleagues here. Thus our PhD (GSAS) students have begun small groups to reach across countries and time zones and to prompt conversations - even for those tied into pods here needing stimulation. "St. Paul's Outside the Walls" are the groups aptly named. For those not grouped into Scripture or book groups, a choice of three weekly topics for grad student/young professionals (GS/YP) is sent out with our Eblast each week. Please do jump in - and let us know of all your witticisms, dilemmas, and conclusions!

In place of our Grad Dinners, our Grad Students and Young Professionals (GS/YP's) now meet on the first Thursdays at 7:00pm (masked and socially distant) in St. Paul's Church at Bow & Arrow Sts., Cambridge for Exposition and the Rosary. On the second Thursdays at 7:00pm our Women's Group gathers for a half holy hour of Benediction followed by The Chaplet of the Divine Mercy. On the third Thursdays of the month at 7:00pm, all are invited to our Holy Hour of Confessions and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. And as ever, after the 9:30am Mass every Sunday all GS/YP's are invited to our Sunday Scriptures Discussion Group which then meets on the lawn before the Cambridge Public Library.

Sunday our Law Students joined the area Catholic lawyers with Cardinal Seán at the Cathedral for the Red Mass, a custom of many centuries for the opening of the legal year. The next night saw our HLS CLSA joining in Zoom to pray the Rosary, a superb way to meditate on the meaning in life of each of the Christian mysteries of faith.

Tonight our Kennedy School students continue their Scripture Discussion Group, focusing on Ecclesiastes. "All is Vanity" of chapters one and two occupied us two meetings ago. "To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under heaven" of chapters 3 & 4 held our attention last week - and in a most touching way! One of us had a dog, Eddie, the most personable of dogs on FaceTime, who died that day - the very day we read Eccles 3:19, "for the lot of man and of beast is one lot: one does as well as the other."

Our Medical Students and Residents will be joining area Physicians with the Cardinal for the White Mass (taken from the color of surgeons and physicians new white garb once they abandoned their blood-caked street clothes after the germ theory of disease of Louis Pasteur and the new sterile operating technique of Lord Lister). The residents are a great help to our med students in sharing wisdom and experiences. Above all, we all meet together every Sunday at Mass. Every week we Read the Scriptures and hear Christ's words in the Gospel. And every week we Count our blessings, Christ's presence in the Eucharist chief among them. Thus all of us Together Give Thanks to God every week for the Gift of His Son: the Eucharist. Thanksgiving indeed!

### YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST

The Eucharist is a gift from God, and the sacrifice of the Mass is an offering of worship that we present to God. This week, let us meditate upon the rich dialogue between man and God that is found in the Eucharistic Prayer: "Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the blessed Passion, the Resurrection from the dead, and the glorious Ascension into heaven of Christ, your Son, our Lord, we, your servants and your holy people, offer to your glorious majesty from the gifts that you have given us, this pure victim, this holy victim, this spotless victim, the holy Bread of eternal life and the Chalice of everlasting salvation. . . . In humble prayer we ask you, almighty God: command that these gifts be borne by the hands of your holy Angel to your altar on high in the sight of your divine majesty, so that all of us, who through this participation at the altar receive the most holy Body and Blood of your Son, may be filled with every grace and heavenly blessing.
