## THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

**November is the month when we pray for our beloved dead, and those with no one to pray for them, with particular care.** I would encourage you to contact Nancy in the main office to give her the names of those you would like remembered during the month. (These are unannounced intentions.) Because of COVID, we have decided not to have the Book of Remembrance or All Souls Envelopes available this year. The Choir School boys had a beautiful service on All Souls Day praying for members of their families and friends who have died. It is important for our youth to learn the importance of respect and prayers for those who have passed away.

**Speaking of the Choir School, we have sponsored two "virtual" Open Houses and look forward to reaching out to even more potential candidates.** We have learned that word of mouth and personal invitation is the best promotion for our school. Please think about families you know who may have good candidates for application and encourage them to see the Choir School website. Thank you!

Last week, Deacon Tim made a formal announcement about the launch of our great new initiative here at St. Paul's: the **Harvard Catholic Forum**. I encourage you to see the new website ([harvardcatholicforum.org](http://harvardcatholicforum.org)) to learn more about this work. There are several events coming up in the near future that you do not want to miss. I have long been planning for ways to make St. Paul's a significant force in the Catholic world on the international level, and the Forum is an important step in this endeavor. Thanks to the staffs at the parish, Choir School and Harvard Catholic Center for their many hours of brainstorming and input, and especially to Deacon Tim for his leadership, along with administrative assistants Kevin Kearns and Luisamaria Hernandez. As with any enterprise which helps the growth of a mission, there are costs involved. The Harvard Catholic Forum is looking for ways to underwrite individual lectures, as well as support for operating costs. For example, Professor Elizabeth Lev, internationally acclaimed art historian and lecturer, will be presenting two talks for us from Rome on December 5 and 12. Her stipend is \$750 per lecture. **Could you make a contribution in memory of a loved one or perhaps in memory of our friend, artist and architect Chip Piatti, who did so much to bring beauty to our church? Feel free to speak with me or Deacon Tim about these possibilities.**

The good news is that more people are coming to Mass; the challenge is that we must be as vigilant and careful as possible with protocols:

- Registering for Mass is necessary. Unfortunately, we have had to turn people away because we had reached capacity. Please go to the parish website.
- Please remember that masks **MUST** be worn *throughout the entire Mass*.
- You may want to wear warmer clothing and gloves as the weather gets cooler. We want to keep the windows and doors open as long as reasonably possible for good ventilation and airflow.
- When the weather turns too cold for open doors/windows, each person will have to make a decision about attending Mass in church, based on one's comfort level with being in an enclosed (though large) place with others (masked and distanced) for one hour.

At this writing, we are on the eve of Election Day. We pray for our country and for all those elected to serve.
