Thanks to all who participated in last week's Commitment Weekend to support the Catholic Appeal. It's not too late to be part of this, so please see information for online giving (bostoncatholicappeal.org) or send it clearly marked through the parish. Thank you!

Deacon Bobby has organized ways for us to give special attention to St. Joseph, during this Year of **St. Joseph**. As a parish we have begun a novena, which will conclude on **the Solemnity, March 19**. See the website for more information. Also, given that it is a Solemnity, it means that the Friday fasts and abstinences of Lent are not in place, so be sure to celebrate appropriately!

Please see the parish website for the many opportunities in place here at St. Paul's: *daily Mass, confessions three times a week, Friday Eucharistic Adoration, Food Pantry volunteering, the Stations of the Cross, Lenten Lunch Program, almsgiving to support parish ministries, and several offerings for intellectual formation and study in the faith.* You can join at any time.

On Wednesdays in March (17 and 24), our parish will continue its outreach by offering "to go" lunches for the homeless of Harvard Square. We depend on your financial support for this work. Please leave any donation in the offertory baskets or send them to the parish. Please indicate that it is for the Lenten Luncheon program. It is a concrete and local way to offer Lenten alms!

Holy Week is not far away (Palm Sunday is March 28.) It would be very helpful to you and to us if you could start to register for Masses and the Good Friday service. Thanks! A reminder that we continue to be as **vigilant and careful as possible with safety protocols for Masses:**

Registering for Mass is necessary so that we can be prepared for COVID-19 tracing and to respect capacity limitations in the church. Please go to the parish website at stpaulparish.org.

Please arrive early for Mass. Registration is not a guarantee for a seat if you arrive after posted Mass times. (We try to accommodate those who arrive without knowledge of the registration system.)

- **When you arrive**, please help us to keep social distancing as people enter the church, especially if an usher is not readily on the scene.
- Please remember that **masks MUST be worn throughout the entire Mass.**
- Please **remember that persons cannot gather in the vestibule after Mass;** feel free to greet one another at a safe distance when you exit the doors of the church.

St. Patrick's Day is this Wednesday. He is the Patron of our Archdiocese and dear to the Irish who funded and built our church in the 1920's.
